On Thursday 16th January, five students from Ixworth competed in the Suffolk Cross Country Finals at Woodbridge School. The students were, as ever, exceptionally behaved throughout the course of the day. With every student also placing commendably in the top 100 (out of 150), they should all be proud of their achievements.

Roman G (11) ran in the inter boy's race. He had said before the race that he would 'take it easy' due to an injury that has kept him out of competitive racing for some time. His 'easy' managed to get him to 4th place out of 150 which meant he qualified with ease for the regional rounds on the 9th February. 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Reporting – Parent's Forum

This week I met with a number of parents online, in person and over the phone to get your feedback on the reporting system, here is a summary of the key points.

The consensus was that the new reporting system is much easier to understand than the old one in terms of identifying which subject's students are doing well or not so well in. One area that caused concern was having a GCSE target on the year 7&8 reports, it was felt this was too early and the percentages alone were enough in terms of targets.

The RAG rating system is popular and gives a clear indication of strengths and weaknesses although further clarification would be useful on how the Red, Amber, and Green bands are set up.

The ATL grades we also well received by most, giving a clear indication of student's attitude in class, it was suggested for newer parents a reminder of how the grading system works might be useful.

As a summative document it was felt by most that the reports work well, the main area for improvement that you fed back to us was around how to make the process more formative. Ideas suggested were advertising the assessments on Arbor with what students need to revise two weeks before the tests are done, then post assessment letting students take the tests home so they can be discussed alongside this posting on Arbor some form of follow up filling the gaps catch up task on areas that have not been done so well.

We will take your feedback onboard and continue to refine and improve the process, so you get the information you need to help students at home.
