We continue to be impressed by the behaviour and attitudes of our students, both in school and when we visit other schools as part of sporting fixtures, our students are head and shoulders above comparable schools.

Our senior invigilator has said how pleased he has been with the behaviour of our Year 11s in their exams, he told me on Thursday that it is "the best since I have been here" (2016).

Sapientia recently carried out a pupil survey for us, collecting over 300 responses from students across all year groups. There were 17 questions, I am pleased to say that our students scored our school in the top three across 9 of the areas, across all Sapientia secondary schools. In addition, our students recorded the greatest number of positive answers for seeing good behaviour in lessons and feeling safe when in school. The survey has additionally given us some areas to focus on to ensure the best possible experience for our students at Ixworth.

Sport Fixtures

Boys from year 8 and 9 competed in the annual U14 rugby festival at Stowmarket RFC. With 4 of the team playing competitive rugby for the first time, it was always going to be a steep learning curve for an inexperienced group.

First game (Stowupland): A couple of early errors and missed tackles meant we were down 3-0 at half time. A spirited team talk from Charlie W and Charlie E resulted in a much improved second half. The game was cut short with Ixworth in the ascendency - however, it was too little, too late, resulting in a 3-2 loss. Charlie W (end to end solo try) and Sam E (first try ever) with the tries. Second game (Mildenhall): Mildenhall proved too powerful in the end with a few club players and a bit more rugby intelligence proving the difference. The game was stopped short with Mildenhall leading 3-1 with Charlie W bagging his second try of the day.

Third game (OSA): Another tough game but Ixworth were starting to develop and progress at a rapid rate. They showed resilience in defence and started to build better patterns in attack. Some strong attacking opposition runs and a couple of Ixworth handling errors proving the difference. Charlie W picking up his third try of the afternoon in a 3-1 loss.

The Ixworth boys left the best rugby until last, beating Stowupland in a rematch from the first game of the afternoon. It ended 3-0 to Ixworth with Carter M and Riley F x 2 scoring their first ever tries! Riley L must get a shout out for an unbelievable defensive performance in the last two games. Riley picked up the player of the tournament award in the process. The boys should be proud of the progress they made. With Thursday lunchtime practices now in place, the boys will continue to progress and develop ready for the 26th February.
