Headteacher

We have continued to recruit this academic year for support staff and have two new staff joining us shortly as a Cover Supervisor and a SEN Admin Assistant. We also have vacancies available for a HLTA, Assistant Site Manager and two LSAs.

In this bulletin I am sharing the homework strategy that we are rolling out using Arbor. We would like to work with parents to ensure this strategy is working. Taking part would consist of around two 1-hour meetings at an agreed time.

We had a visit from Thurston Sixth form this week explaining their Post 16 offer to our Year 11s. These visits are often an indication of how close we are to our students moving on to the next stage of their education, and how close we are to their first public exams. Our Year 11s have had a very positive start to the year, and we are pleased with their focus and enthusiasm. We will have a series of events to support them this year and signpost future opportunities.

On Thursday we were visited by our Trust to review the progress and plans for the school moving forward, they looked at the entire day from arrival to departure, social times, observed lessons and met with a range of staff and students. They also used the data from the ParentView site and how feedback will assist us in moving the school forward. The team were especially positive around the behaviour and attitudes of our students. I will share more details once we have the full report.

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Homework

We have finalised how we will set and monitor homework. In the last bulletin I explained how often homework will be set:

For Maths, English, Science, and all option subjects – up to 1 hour per week

For subjects with 2 lessons per fortnight - 2 or more homework's per half term

For subjects with 1 lesson per fortnight – 1 or more homework's per half term

We do not set homework usually for Core PE, PSHE or RE.

Homework will consist of a range of different tasks, it will be recorded on Arbor by the class teacher, this might provide a link to other platforms. We are checking each student to ensure that they can access Arbor and helping if needed. This is a short explanation of how parents can view set homework.

Step 1: Logging in

First time students log in all they need to do is enter their new school email and it will prompt them to set a password or to do password reset which will send a link to the school email.Students will need to use the website rather than the parent app.

Step 2: Submitting

If using a separate online platform to do the homework all students need to do is hit submit, as these are marked on the subject specific site no further action on Arbor is taken

If students are required to upload a document they upload a document and hit submit, once the teacher has marked it that mark will appear for the student and also in your gradebook.

Step 3: Parental tracking

On each students profile there is a dashboard of all outstanding Assignments, clicking on each assignment brings up the details of what's required. On the same page you will see marked assignments for pieces of work that are manually marked by teachers.
